
## **August Fretboard Exercises**

Exercise 2 was composed by Juventino Rosas in Mexico when he was just 20 years old. He died six years later on a tour to Cuba, where he came down with spinal myelitis. He remains one the best-known Mexican composers, and *Sobre Las Olas* is his best-known work. Internationally it is regarded as a symphonic waltz (see London youtube), while in the U.S. the tune is associated with circuses, calliopes and carousels due to its inclusion in Wurlitzer fairgrounds organs.
